Committee and Work Group Reports

Social Committee (Marilyn VanLieshout)

There are only three events currently scheduled in 2020: Annual meeting and Social (7/11/20), a Youth Event (TBA), and the Fall Dinner (9/12/20). If anyone has comments/concerns please contact a director or Marilyn VanLieshout.

Water Quality/Vegetation Control Committee (Mark Weisse)

Fall 2019 we started a sample Natural Shoreline plot next to the west side boat ramp as an introduction of the Natural Shoreline project. This year we will continue with a demonstration of native plants and soft bioengineering at the west side boat ramp. Volunteers and equipment will be needed so watch for the announcements later this spring.

We will join with Kangaroo Lake Association and the Ridges to publicize the Healthy Lakes grant program and explore other sustainable, low cost options so more owners can establish at least 35 feet of native vegetative buffer along their lake front.

Phragmites continues to require our attention. We will have a work day in the spring to cull dead canes from a large patch. There is no chemical involved in this part of the process. Watch for an announcement and call for volunteers. Volunteers will also be required in the late summer.

The ramp volunteers continue to do trailer inspection for invasive species and coach boaters about lake safety and to limit activities in water less than 5 feet in depth. This is an opportunity to contribute to preserving the lake so please consider volunteering.

The committee and board need to establish a plan to further protect and re-establish our bulrush beds.

WQVC meeting schedule was posted February 2020, starting on 3/9/20.

Lake Safety/ Lake Maintenance (Bob Defaut & Chuck Birringer)

Last year a group of volunteers removed stones from the launch area at the West Shore Boat Launch. If Water conditions permit, we may need volunteers to continue this project again in June 2020.

As is the case each year volunteers will also be needed to install and remove the lake buoys and the Ridges dock. Since these tasks typically require calm wind conditions, volunteers must be available on demand in May and again in October. Fish/Wildlife Committee (Pat Canney)

The fisheries committee did not initiate any fish habitat work this winter. We had only one site available and it is not worth the planning and coordination to do one site. Our fish sticks permit runs thru 2022 and hopefully with the addition of extra sites we will return to the ice next winter to continue the work.

The DNR completed the fish sampling survey (Spring and Fall 2019) to get a firsthand look at the fish populations on the lake. The Report has not been completed. We will keep you updated as we have more information.

Communications Committee (Chuck Birringer)

Except for the Annual Letter, the Directory (published every other year), the Annual Meeting, Annual Picnic and Fall Dinner Flyers which are still in hardcopy, all other communication with the membership is made electronically via the website. Our goal is to have all communication electronically. If you have not provided CLAA with your email address or that of a friend or a relative please do so on the attached membership form with your annual dues.

Ad Hoc Committee (Mark Weisse & Gwenn Graboyes)

We currently have an Ad Hoc Committee that is studying the possible purchase of AEDs for use around Clark Lake. Unfortunately, this committee was not been able to meet in 2019. We hope to revisit this project in 2020. Depending on the findings of this committee we may be asking members for funding.

History Work Group (Unassigned)

The History Work Group is not an active work group at this time. Several years ago the history of Clark Lake was gathered and professionally put on a CD for sale. We are currently looking for a coordinator to continue this research. Contact one of the current directors if you are interested

Cooperative Purchasing Work Group (Chuck Birringer)

The plan is to continue the propane (Lakes), asphalt paving and the garbage/recycling (Going) contracts in 2020. Between the FCC shutting down the Door County Broadband (DCB) tower on Clark Lake in April 2020 and the financial problems Frontier Communications is currently experiencing the internet options are shrinking around Clark Lake. A new internet tower provided by DCB is in the works but it may be a year or two before they will be able to provide internet service on Clark Lake. Charter/Spectrum has been contacted, but communication has been moving very slowly. There are a few satellite internet options that are available but this option can be pricey. Probably the best option right now is cellular internet. New/Notices will be sent from the CLAA website as promotions from internet providers become available.

Don't forget June 1, 2020 is the deadline for dues if you want to participate in this year's propane contract.

Treasurer's Report and Annual Dues

Paid membership end of 2019 was 240 compared to 243 in 2018.

End of 2019 numbers were: Cash balance of \$26,449.20; Designated for projects \$4,981.03; Undesignated funds \$21,468.17; Member donations \$1,160; and total disbursements for 2019 were \$5994.56, under budget of \$9,282.

Entering 2020, the CLAA is in a very sound financial condition, which favorably positions the organization to fulfill its stated mission of protecting and enhancing the enjoyment of Clark Lake.
